#### **Stop the Scam**

Welfare fraud and abuse cost taxpayers billions and rob limited resources from the truly vulnerable. Under Stop the Scam, states use advanced technology to conduct regular eligibility reviews, ensuring limited resources are only directed to those who qualify.

### Work Requirements

Federal law requires non-disabled adults without kids to work at least 20 hours per week in order to receive food stamps. Work requirements have proven to be an effective way to help adults go back to work, more than doubling their incomes. Work requirements have also led to adults cutting their time on welfare in half.

## 3 Income Limits

Federal law limits income of food stamp recipients to 130% of the federal poverty level—roughly \$2,600 per month for a family of four. However, due to a loophole that has allowed states to raise the income threshold above the federal limit, welfare has expanded to between 2 and 3 million people and increased taxpayer costs by more than \$1 billion.

#### 4 Asset Tests

Federal law limits assets of food stamp recipients to \$2,250 or \$3,250, but 34 states have used loopholes to waive the asset test altogether. By restoring asset testing to the federal baseline, taxpayers would save more than \$7 billion nationally.

### **5** Child Support

Although child support is a critical tool to reducing poverty, only 27% of single-parent families on food stamps actually receive it. States can disqualify parents from food stamp assistance who fail to cooperate with child support enforcement agencies or owe unpaid court-ordered child support.
